Jeffrey J. Tomaszewski, MD, Head, Division of Urology and Director, Genitourinary Oncology Center at MD Anderson at Cooper, was named one of America's Best Prostate Cancer Surgeons by Newsweek and Statista. He is one of only 150 surgeons nationwide to receive this prestigious honor.

Dr. Tomaszewski and the urologic oncology team are among the few skilled in performing Retzius-sparing prostatectomy, which significantly improves post-operative continence and enhances early return of erectile function. MD Anderson at Cooper urologic oncologists perform almost all prostatectomies using this approach.

MD Anderson at Cooper was one of only 20 cancer centers worldwide, and the first in New Jersey and the Philadelphia region, to offer histotripsy – a revolutionary new treatment for liver cancer. Histotripsy uses sound waves to destroy cancerous liver tumors. Studies show it has a 95% success rate in destroying tumors without harming surrounding tissues. **Young Ki Hong, MD, MPH, FACS, FSSO,** leads the team.

In Memoriam: Edward D. Viner, MD

Edward D. Viner, MD, Chief Emeritus of Cooper's Department of Medicine, Professor at Cooper Medical School of Rowan University, and member of the Board of Trustees, passed away December 1. A pioneer in end-of-life care, Dr. Viner leaves a profound legacy of compassion, dedication to medicine, and service to the community.

Dr. Viner's distinguished career began at Harvard College, followed by medical studies at the University of Pennsylvania. He was recognized as one of the region's leading internal medicine specialists. His personal experience with illness ignited his passion for hospice care, leading him to establish the first hospice program in the Philadelphia region in 1975. Dr. Viner's work in end-of-life care had a lasting impact, and he advocated for dignified care at the national level, including testifying before the House Select Committee on Aging in 1985.

In 1987, Dr. Viner became Chief of Medicine at Cooper, where he led the adoption of the first hospitalist system in the Philadelphia area and laid the foundation for the Cooper Medical School of Rowan University. He received numerous accolades throughout his career, including the prestigious Laureateship from the American College of Physicians NJ Chapter and the Philadelphia Caring Award.

To honor his legacy, Cooper dedicated the Dr. Edward D. Viner Intensive Care Unit and established the first endowed chief position in his name. Dr. Viner's impact on Cooper, medical education, and patient care will continue to inspire generations.

Military

Cooper is at the forefront of scientific and technological innovation aimed at improving medical care for the **U.S. Armed Forces.** Cooper's research initiatives are advancing trauma care technologies that benefit both military personnel and civilians. Through Cooper's **military clinical training program**, life-saving medical advancements are integrated into training for non-trauma trained military personnel. As a trusted partner in training **all branches of Special Operations Forces medical teams**, Cooper provides critical expertise to enhance battlefield medical care.



In May 2024, Cooper's Section of Military, Diplomatic, and Field Surgical Affairs training program teamed up with the Salem County Sheriff's Office and the Salem County Office of Emergency Management to present the week-long Mid-Atlantic Severe Situation Exercise (MASSE) to provide intensive point-of-injury field training for emergency responders with cadavers in a simulated real-world setting. More than 275 military learners, law enforcement, tactical EMS team, firefighters and rescue EMS personnel from New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, and New York attended the event to help them refresh and/or gain new skills in responding to potential real-world situations.

Cooper Receives "We Value Our Veterans" Award

Cooper was recognized with the **"We Value Our Veterans"** Employer Award by the N.J. Governor's Department of Veterans Affairs for its commitment to supporting veterans and veteran causes. As the only Level I Trauma Center in southern New Jersey, Cooper is a recognized leader in trauma surgery and critical care. We are proud to train elite medical providers from all branches of the U.S. military as well as local, state, and international partners. Cooper was the first hospital in the nation to establish the Army Military Civilian Trauma Training Program (AMCT3) and is one of only three hospitals nationwide to offer specialized training through the SMART initiative for military personnel.

HeroCare Connect: Supporting Veterans, Active-Duty Personnel, and Their Families

In 2024, Cooper scheduled more than 2,500 specialty care appointments, including more than 500 same-day appointments, in support of the HeroCare Connect health care concierge program, a partnership between Cooper and Deborah Heart and Lung Center, in support of the region's active and retired military.



The Cooper Catheterization Lab team celebrated accreditation by the American College of Cardiology, recognizing Cooper as having the latest science and improvement systems for pre-, peri-, and post-procedures essential to the safe care and efficient scheduling of patients.

Cooper and Inspira Cardiac Care Team Celebrates Patient Milestone

A special reunion took place at Cooper October 17, 2024, when Marjorie Couch, a heart attack survivor, reunited with her medical teams from Cooper and Inspira Cardiac Care, in celebration of her recovery, two years after she received an Impella heart pump.

Leading the Region With Groundbreaking Cardiology Procedures

Cooper is the first health system in the region, and one of only a few in the country, to use the to use the **FARAPULSE™ PFA System by Boston Scientific** for treatment of atrial fibrillation (AFib), or an irregular or rapid heart rhythm. FARAPULSE™ uses ultra-rapid electrical pulses, called pulsed field ablation, to treat AFib versus traditional radiofrequency or cryothermal ablation.

Ketan Gala, MD, FACC, clinical cardiologist and Medical Director of the Advanced Heart Failure Program and Adam Levine, DO, FACC, FSCAI, interventional cardiologist, implanted the hospital's first two **CardioMEMS** $^{\text{\tiny M}}$ **HF Systems by Abbot,** launching a new and innovative monitoring tool for patients with heart failure.



A team of cardiologists at Cooper was the first in the region to implant the **EVOQUE tricuspid valve replacement system**, the first transcatheter therapy to receive U.S. Food and Drug Administration approval for the treatment of tricuspid regurgitation. The EVOQUE system is indicated for the improvement of health status in patients with tricuspid regurgitation. These patients often have no other treatment options.

Neuroscience Team Completes First Vivistim[®] Procedure in South Jersey

In a milestone for stroke rehabilitation in the region, a Cooper and Inspira Neuroscience team, led by Daniel A. Tonetti, MD, MS, cerebrovascular and endovascular neurosurgeon and Director of Cerebrovascular Neurosurgery and the Acute Stroke and NeuroInterventional Suite, successfully completed South Jersey's first procedure using the FDA-approved **Vivistim® Paired VNS[™] System.**

This groundbreaking technology uses nerve stimulation to enhance upper limb function in stroke survivors during rehabilitation. Proven to generate two to three times more hand and arm function compared with therapy alone, the Vivistim[®] system facilitates neuroplasticity and strengthens neural connections, significantly improving the quality of life for survivors of chronic ischemic stroke.

For those who continue to face moderate to severe deficits in arm and hand function even six months after a stroke, this innovative system offers new hope and a path to recovery.

Cooper is proud to offer a nurse residency program that supports new-to-practice nurses' successful transition to professional practice. In 2024, 124 nurse residents graduated from the program, which boasted a 12-month satisfaction rating above state and national benchmarks.

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Accelerated Nursing Education Program

In 2024, Cooper partnered with Thomas Edison State University and BAYADA Home Health Care to form The Thomas Edison State University (TESU) Accelerated BSN BAYADA Scholars Track at Cooper University Health Care. The 15-month Bachelor of Science in Nursing program is designed for adults who have earned a bachelor's degree and are interested in becoming registered nurses. Recent college graduates and midcareer professionals who want to find meaningful and mission-driven work will have an opportunity to complete a nursing degree in a little more than a year. There are currently 30 students enrolled in the program.

Center for Advanced Practice Symposium

The Center for Advanced Practice hosted their Annual APP Symposium at the DoubleTree by Hilton in Cherry Hill on November 1. The event highlighted advances in patient care, with Cooper advanced practice professionals sharing research and best practice findings with their peers in the field.



Respiratory Therapy Honored With Apex Recognition

Cooper's Respiratory Therapy team was one of only 29 recipients honored with the American Association for Respiratory Care's 2023-2024 Apex Recognition Award. This prestigious award, a first for Cooper, distinguishes programs for their commitment to excellence in professional development, evidence-based care, patient safety, and quality improvement.

Cooper launched a respiratory therapy residency program aimed at supporting new-to-practice respiratory therapists as they enter the workforce. Cooper has had two cohorts to date, with a 100% conversion rate from graduate respiratory therapist to licensed therapist.



Cooper Air Medical Services

Cooper Air Medical Services continues to demonstrate consistent growth in transport volume. In 2024, there was a 9% increase in the number of patients transported from outlying hospitals to Cooper. Cooper Air Medical Services bridges the geographic gap and minimizes delays in getting critical patients with time sensitive illnesses and injuries to Cooper for care.

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Emergency Medical Services

Cooper EMS received the Mission: Lifeline EMS Gold award, the highest-level of recognition from the American Heart Association, for cardiac and neurological care provided by our EMS team.

Cooper partnered with Atlantic Cape Community College (ACCC) to provide paramedic students with a site to complete their 400-hour clinical internship. Of six applicants, Cooper accepted two students, who upon successful completion of their internship and licensure have accepted positions as full-time paramedics with Cooper EMS. In spring 2025, Cooper will host two additional ACCC students for their clinical internships.

In 2024, **Cooper Advanced Life Support (ALS)** units arrived within the critical eight-minute benchmark on 91% of ALS calls. Cooper ALS units have met this benchmark every year since inception of the service. This quality measure demonstrates our commitment to providing the highest level of service.

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Cooper Medical School of Rowan University: Match Day Sets Record

On Match Day, medical students nationwide learn where they will train for their residency. In 2024, Match Day at CMSRU saw its largest class, with 49% entering primary care and 51% pursuing specialty residencies. Of these students, 35% will stay in New Jersey, with 21 matching at Cooper.

CMSRU Recognized Among Best Medical Schools

CMSRU earned top rankings in the 2024 U.S. News & World Report **Best Medical Schools** list, achieving **Tier 2 in Primary Care**—the highest in the Philadelphia region and New Jersey—and **Tier 3 in Research**.



CMSRU Dedicates Humanism Center to Edward D. Viner, MD

CMSRU named its Center for Humanism in honor of its founder, Edward D. Viner, MD.

Dr. Viner was a pioneer in medicine and founded the Humanism Center in 2015 to embed humanistic values in medical training. As CMSRU's honorary first dean, he played a key role in establishing the four-year medical school in Camden, NJ.

The renaming follows a generous gift from an anonymous donor recognizing Dr. Viner's lasting impact on medical education.

Class of 2024 Commencement

In May, CMSRU celebrated its largest graduating class to date—109 students. Dean Annette C. Reboli, MD, commended the Class of 2024 for their resilience during the pandemic and emphasized empathy, humility, and patient advocacy.

Keynote speaker Dr. Darilyn Moyer, CEO of the American College of Physicians, spoke about the essential values of humility, curiosity, resilience, and continuous learning in medicine.

The ceremony concluded with the hooding of each graduate and the recitation of the Hippocratic Oath, marking their transition to physicians. The Class of 2024 joins more than 630 CMSRU alumni in practice and training nationwide.



CMSRU Welcomes 113 Future Physicians at White Coat Ceremony


On August 9, 113 students from CMSRU's Class of 2028 donned their white coats, marking their entry into the medical profession. The White Coat Ceremony included the traditional cloaking ceremony and the students' first recitation of the Hippocratic Oath.

The event honored Dr. Edward Viner with the Rowan University Medal of Excellence for his contributions to medical education and patient care.

Multidisciplinary Neurological Recovery Study

J. Hope Kilgannon, MD, Associate Professor of Emergency Medicine, serves as Cooper's principal investigator for the ICECAP trial, a landmark NIH-funded multicenter study. This randomized controlled trial explores optimal targeted temperature management strategies to enhance neurological recovery in survivors of out-of-hospital cardiac arrest.

The study involves multidisciplinary collaboration across Emergency Medicine, Critical Care, Cardiology, and Neurology, as well as prehospital emergency medical services. Cooper has distinguished itself as a leading enrollment center among more than 75 participating sites nationwide, reinforcing its commitment to advancing neurological recovery research.



Barrett's Esophagus Research

The Division of Gastroenterology is actively participating in the NIH-funded SURVENT trial, a landmark multicenter study comparing surveillance and endoscopic eradication therapy for patients with Barrett's esophagus with low-grade dysplasia. Led by Anthony Infantolino, MD, FACP, FACG, AGAF, MASGE, and Christina Tofani, MD, FACG, FASG, experts in Barrett's esophagus, the study strengthens Cooper's collaboration with the MD Anderson at Cooper team in managing Barrett's esophagus and early esophageal cancer.

MD Anderson at Cooper Research: Advancing Cancer Care Through Innovation

The MD Anderson at Cooper research team had a record-breaking year in 2024 with 21 new clinical trials opened, 440 patients who took part in a research study, and 61 patients who were treated during therapeutic clinical trials that provide new and cutting-edge treatment options.

MD Anderson at Cooper was recognized by our partner MD Anderson Cancer Center with Research Engagement and Top Investigator Enrollment awards for leading an innovative clinical trial that aims to make radiation therapy even more precise and comfortable for patients with head and neck cancer by 3D printing customized oral stents.

Our team is supporting new cancer discoveries by launching the Cooper Coriell Biobank, part of the Camden Cancer Research Center, to create a biospecimen resource available to cancer researchers to find new cancer targets and develop better treatments. **TO EDUCATE**

Cooper Innovation Center

The Cooper Innovation Center (CIC) was established to protect and advance both patentable and unpatentable ideas related to products and processes developed by Cooper team members.

In 2024, the CIC received 17 invention disclosures, with eight patent applications submitted to the U.S. Patent Office. Additionally, the CIC secured \$625,000 in external funding for technology development and executed seven license or option agreements to commercialize Cooper technologies.

The CIC remains dedicated to driving innovation and transforming novel ideas into real-world solutions.
